National Water Safety Congress Cold Water Immersion Survival and Rescue, Recover, Re-Warm



The first part of the program is designed to educate rescue specialists (including law enforcement, firefighters, EMS providers, lifeguards, first responders) and boating safety educators about the risks associated with cold water immersion. It is also intended as a teacher's guide to *Cold Water Boot Camp USA* providing in-depth information for water safety instructors focusing on the three significant effects of cold water immersion: shock, incapacitation and hypothermia.



The second part, *Beyond Boot Camp*, will educate first responders on how to more safely and effectively deal with the rescue, recovery and re-warming of a hypothermic victim. Instruction will be provided on the safest and most proper way to contribute to the success of a rescue, recovery and re-warming protocol.



National Water Safety Congress Personal Watercraft Education Course: Basic Operation, Maintenance and Rescue

The Personal Watercraft Education Basic Operation, Maintenance and Rescue Course is a two-day/16-hour course designed for the educator and rescue professional, providing students with basic knowledge of personal watercraft operation and rescue techniques. Students will leave this course with a certificate of completion.
